

System Neither Mesozoic nor Tertiary rocks are found in place in the quadrangles, but the basal part of the glacial drift in several places contains many wellrounded pebbles of quartz. Here and there are found small deposits of quartz and chert gravel containing some pebbles of igneous rock, all colored a dark red by iron oxide. Such a deposit is found under the more recent gravels at Spring Valley in the SW. 4 sec-35, Hall Township. At this place there are 6 to 10 feet of greatly oxidized quartz pebbles lying above the Coal Measures strata and underlying a bed of silt or loess....
