When an Administration is convinced that a mobile station is not fulfilling these regulations, it must, in every case, address a complaint to the Administration of the country to which the station is subject. Reporting of Infractions. XC. 1. If an Administration has information of a breach of the Convention, or of the Regulations, committed in one of the stations which it has authorized, it shall ascertain the facts and fix the responsibility. If the responsibility rests on the operator, the Administration shall take the necessary steps, and if necessary, shall endorse or withdraw the certificate. If the responsibility rests on a licensee or (where a mobile station is concerned) on the captain or other officer in charge, the same procedure may be followed in respect of the license. 2.
