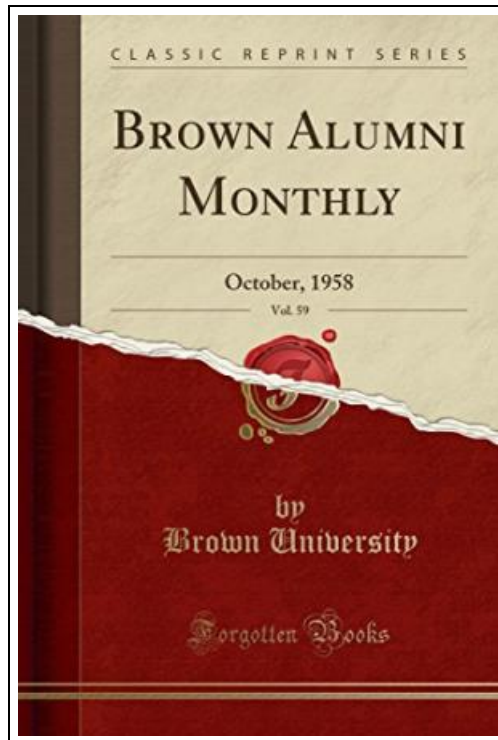

However, much of what I shall say will also be largely applicable to other scientists, such as those in Chemistry and Geology, and usually to engineers as well. Because of the instabilities of Russian life since 1917, the background of the Soviet scientist varies markedly with his age. Thus, if he is over 60, his early education was in Tsarist times; he most likely comes, therefore, from the middle-class background of people who could afford education in that period. If he is between 40 and 60, he may well come from almost any stratum of society. In the period immediately after the Revolution, much emphasis was placed on the education of peasant and worker children; at that time many of the middle class were hindered by their political unreliability. Finally, if we look beyond the war generation of the young est scientists oi today, we find somewhat of a return to a re striction of higher education to those of the new higher classes - the Party officials, the Civil Service (including the teachers and scientists), and the Russian equivalent of the managerial class.
