

Sulphates may exist in the salt as in the water used in making the bread, as well as in the grain itself. Microscopical Examination.--The starch grains of wheaten flour in bread suffer rather more change than they do in the manufacture of biscnit. By the dough-making and baking the grains are enlarged, doubled up, and more or less distorted, and lose much of their refracting property.
