P. fenestrata is represented in the Middle Cambrian fauna of China by cruciform spicules embedded in limestone, that have four slender, round rays meeting at the center of the spicule, but no specimens were found with indications of the skeleton of the sponge. The presence of spicules resembling those of P. fenestrata in the Ceratopyge limestone of Sweden is discussed by Moberg and Segerberg and an illustration given (pl. 1, fig. 5), but with the data available it is difficult to determine if the spicules belong to this species or to P. hicksi or an undetermined species.
