When the aspirator bottle is empty, five liters of the producer gas have passed through the washing bottles. The temperature of the gas passing through the absorbing solution is noted by means of a thermometer passing through the stopper of one of them. The apparatus is then taken back to the laboratory and the bottles are disconnected and their contents transferred to a 750 c. c. beaker, carefully washing out all of the bromine water with distilled water. Now add two grams of sodium carbonate to the solution and heat to boiling temperature, on the hot plate or other safe device. After the solution begins to boil add 20 c. c. of strong hydrochloric acid and continue boiling until the bromine is boiled off. The sulphur may now be precipitated by 20 c. c. of a hot...
