

## John Bunyan and the Language of Conviction (Hardback)

This book undertakes a major reassessment of the works of John Bunyan (1628-88), the nonconformist author of The Pilgrim s Progress, who was imprisoned for preaching his beliefs. Through a reading of each of his narratives, and many of his pastoral writings, both in textual detail and in relation to the various traditions - such as Reformed spirituality and the nonconformist trial - within which he lived, preached, and wrote, the author offers a systematic reevaluation of Bunyan s development as an author. She presents new perspectives on his most popular works, Grace Abounding and The Pilgrim s Progress, whilst arguing that the significance of the lesser-known Life and Death of Mr Badman and The Holy War has been severely underestimated; and she shows how overall the works offer a candid document of nonconformist experience in the Restoration period.
