

Patents are also granted for designs but this paper is restricted to the consideration of only such patents as are referred to in the definition just stated. According to Walker on Patents, 4th Edition, paragraph 172: Letters-Patent are documents consisting of the grant and the specification; and where drawings form a part of the application, they also form a part of the letters-patent. The grant is a paper, issued in the name of the United States, under the seal of the Patent Office, and signed by the Commissioner of Patents. It contains a short title...
