How does France reconcile the modern movement toward pluralism and decentralization with a strong central governing power? Since the publication of Tocqueville s Ancient Regime and the Revolution , French political structures have been viewed as the pure expression of a native Jacobinism, itself the continuation of an old absolutism. Pierre Rosanvallon, by contrast, argues that the French have cherished and demonized Jacobinism at the same time; their hearts followed Robespierre, but their heads turned toward Benjamin Constant. The Demands of Liberty traces the long history of resistance to Jacobinism, including the creation of associations and unions and the implementation of elements of decentralization.
