Since the beginning of China's economic reforms and development, modernisation theorists have always been in the front-line when it came down to predicting the country's soon-to-come political liberalisation. However, after decades of contradictory results of quantitative studies on the alleged causal relationship between economic development and democracy, there is growing consent to Seymour Martin Lipset's statement that [w]hether democracy succeeds or fails continues to depend significantly on the choices, behaviors, and decisions of political leaders and groups (Lipset 1994: 18). Completely in line with what the German political scientist Wolfgang Muno describes as the need for qualitative analyses of [] important actors, concepts and strategies (Muno...
