Upon arrival at Contrexeville a laboratory was established which was prepared to do gross and microscopic pathology, bacteriology, and clinical pathology. Patients were first admitted to Base Hospital No. 31 on March 23, 1918. The central laboratory for the two base hospitals was organized April 8, 1918. On April 8, 1918, the director of laboratories and infectious diseases, American Expeditionary Forces, recommended the pooling of the laboratory equipment of Base Hospitals Nos. 31 and 32 and the formation of a central laboratory. He also recommended the formation of a number of smaller subsidiary laboratories...
